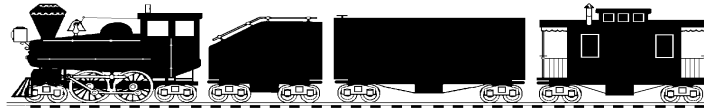

commitments, and we operated by a code of honor and ceremony, and we stood up loud and strong for veterans and community service. Our members were small but growing each year.

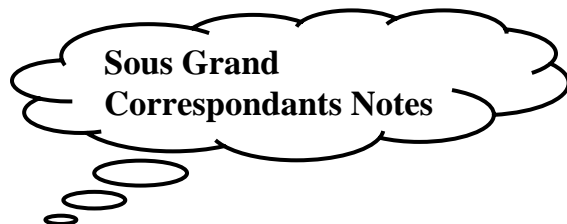

GRANDE PROMENADE, JUNE 26, 2011
Best Western Hotel, Festus, Missouri

Grand Chef de Gare, Larry Ebersold, opened the Grande Promenade at 9:00 AM with a salute to the Flag, the Pledge of Allegiance, and a much needed prayer by Grand Aumonier, John Paul Kopp.

Roll call of officers showed a few more excused, a few more absent, and the rest claimed to be here, many paid fines. Roll call of Grand Chefs de Gare Passe, showed there were nine present. Roll call of Voitures showed there was a quorum present. Absent were Voitures 3, 293, 333, 447, 520, 966, 1395, 1402, and 1403. While the roll call was being done Tom Goodin was still checking everyone's card and password. Rich Heigert gave the Rules of Procedure. Notion offered by Grant Willis, seconded by Art Wilson, that the Rules of Procedure be followed...passed.

Notion offered by Ed Jones, second by Virgil Morice, that the minutes of the June 27, 2010 Grande Promenade be accepted as printed and sent out...passed.

Grand Directeur Youth Sports Dave Voyles said the reports added up to \$148,083. 1st place is Voiture 460, 2nd place is Voiture 1321, and 3rd place is Voiture 760.

Grand Chef Ebersold called on the Grande Promenade Committees starting with the Audit Committee chaired by Rich Heigert with the help of Ralph Turner. Also present were Grand Commissaire Intendant Ed Jones and Grand Correspondant Terry Lanning. Rich stated that the Audit took place on June 25, 2011 at the Best Western Hotel at 9:30 AM. The Committee reviewed all deposits and disbursements and validated the Financial Report of June 25, 2011. The Grande began the year with \$2,709.68 and had deposits totaling \$6,700.64. Expenses totaled \$6,626.56 leaving a final balance of \$2,783.76. The Money Market account reflected a balance of \$957.03, plus 4 CD's. The total assets of the Grand as of June 25, 2011 are \$24,740.79. The committee also recommends that due to the low rate of interest that all Savings Certificates be renewed for 1 year. The committee thanked Grand Commissaire Intendant Ed Jones for the job he did and will overlook the 10 cent error. Notion offered by Rich, seconded by George Ridley, to approve the Audit Committee Report and the finance report as presented...passed.

Grand Chef Ebersold called on the Resolutions Committee chaired by Grant Willis. Grant reported that he opened the committee at 9:30am in the hospitality room. Grant stated he had resolutions for David Christian for Grand Chef de Gare, Ed Jones for Grand Chef de Train, Ralph Turner for Grand Commissaire Intendant, Terry L. Lanning for Grand Correspondant, and Terry L. Lanning for National Commissaire Intendant. The committee approved these resolutions. There were no other resolutions. It is the recommendation of the committee that the first four resolutions be read by the Grand Correspondant during the election of officer's and voted on by the floor for a favorable vote. Grant offered a notion for the approval of the resolution for Terry Lanning for National Commissaire Intendant, seconded by George Ridley...passed. The committee adjourned at 9:45am. Grant offered a notion for the Resolutions Committees report to be accepted, seconded by George Ridley ...passed.

Grand Chef Ebersold called on the Chairman of the Credential Committee, David Christian. Dave gave the voting strength for each Voitures and the overall for the Grand Voiture (67) and Dave offered a notion, second by George Ridley, that the report be accepted as given...passed.

Grand Chef Ebersold called on the Constitution Committee chaired by Robert Phillips. Robert reported that there was one resolution to change the constitution submitted by Voiture 448. He opened the committee at 9:28am in the hotel lobby. The resolution changed the number of Sous Grand Chefs de Train from six to "one or more" and dropped Chef de Gare Locale and Junior Chef de Gare Passe Locale from delegate strength, and changed he to he/she and his to his/her. Robert offered a notion, second by Virgil Morice, that the report be accepted as given...passed.

Distinguished Voyageur Award Committee, Ray Brodzinski, stated the award was presented last night to Gerald Fitzgerald.

Grand Chef Ebersold called on the Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Art Wilson. Art reported that the meeting was held at the Best Western Hotel and started at 8:30 AM. There were a number of voyageurs in attendance. The

Nominating Committee recommends to the Grande the elected officers. Art read the recommendation of the Committee for elective officers for 2011-2012.

Grand Chef Ebersold relieved the members of the Grande Promenade Committees.

Newly elected David S. Christian gave a stirring speech. The Grande needs to get new members.

The Promenade was recessed at 10:05 AM to let the families and friends in for the Memorial Service and installation of officers.

The Grande Promenade came back to order at 10:20 AM. Grand Chef Ebersold turned the podium over to Grand Aumonier, John Paul Kopp. He was assisted by Rich Heigert and Grand Correspondant, Terry Lanning for the Memorial Service.

The history book was presented to Grand Chef de Gare Gary Ebersold by the Grand Historien Richard Pack. Grand Chef de Gare Gary Ebersold thanked him.

Grand Chef Ebersold asked that the installing officer come to the podium. The installing officer was Terry Lanning, Commissaire Intendant Nationale. He installed the newly elected Grand Chef de Gare, David S. Christian, first. Afterwards he installed the rest of the elected and appointed officers.

Installing Officer, Terry Lanning, took out the Past Grand Chef de Gare Ebersold and presented him with a Past Grand Chef's pin. Larry Ebersold then spoke to the membership thanking them for the great year he had.

GRAND CHEMINOT, JUNE 25, 2011

With a rap of the gavel, Grand Chef de Gare, Larry Ebersold, opened the Grand Cheminot sharply at 1:00 PM with a salute to the Flag, the Pledge of Allegiance, and a much needed prayer by Grand Aumonier, John Paul Kopp.

Roll call of officers showed more absent than excused and the rest were being rambunctious. Roll call of Grand Chefs de Gare Passe was almost forgotten by Grand Chef but when finally made nine answered. Roll call of Grand Cheminots showed that we had a quorum. Voyageurs don't know how to answer roll call and many paid fines for it. Absent were Voitures 3, 293, 333, 447, 520, 966, 1395, 1402, and 1403. Voyageur Tom Goodin did not know the password and it cost him, that showed him he cannot rely on the Grand Chef's advice.

Rich Heigert actually read the Grand Voiture's Rules of Procedure. Notion offered by Kevin Johnson, seconded by Virgil Morice, that Rules of Procedure be followed. Notion offered by Kevin Johnson, seconded by Virgil Morice, the Grand Spring Cheminot minutes be accepted as printed and sent out...passed.

Ray Brodzinski brought up whether this Cheminot, during the Grand Promenade weekend should be just call the Grand Promenade. It was decided to bring this up at the Executive meeting at the Fall Cheminot.

Grand Correspondant Terry Lanning told everyone that there were papers going around asking if you are going to the Nationale Promenade and if you have an email address. A number of Voitures have not sent in their new Officers and Directeurs; get them in as soon as possible.

Grand Correspondant Lanning read the following resolutions: Ed Jones for Grand Chef de Train and Ralph Turner for Grand Commissaire Intendant.

Grand Commissaire Intendant, Ed Jones, reported that the finance report was passed out and discussed. Approval will be after the audit report.

Grand Chef de Train, David Christian, reported on the current Grande membership. The Grande has 1209 members, 96%. We need 49 to be 100% so everyone go back and see about getting a few members turned in. David asked the Sous Chef de Trains to report to which Tom Goodin, Norm Gentry and Ralph Turner reported on the Voitures they are assigned. Chef Larry Ebersold presented a 100% membership pins to Voiture 130 and 1379 Chef de Gares.

Grand Cheminot reports were given by Voiture 38, 130, 292, 448, 460, 760, 1292, 1321, 1379, 1403, and 1541. Some of the highlights are Voiture 38 attended an Easter parade, had a memorial service with Voiture 448 participating and they help at the naturalization ceremony; Voiture 130 stated Denny's fundraiser did not raise very much, they are selling towels to fund their 10 nurses, they sent 700 blankets to Joplin; Voiture 292 said their Bingo is not doing as good as it was, they sponsor 19 nurses; Voiture 448 had an Easter egg hunt, fundraiser BBQ, and participated in a flag retirement; Voiture 460 spent \$8,823 to assist home fires, utilities, St. Nicks Benefit, Children's Christmas Party, they have 28 Nurses in Training, sponsored youth teams for \$9,725, and donated \$8,634 for new flags, Wounded Warriors, and American Cancer Society; Voiture 760 was in a Veterans Day Parade, spent \$3,500 for Boys State, and \$2,000 for Nurses Training; Voiture 1292 has 3 nurses, will be having BBQ's and a raffle; Voiture 1321 has their cooker out and has 5 nurses in Training; Voiture 1379 reached 100% as promised, they will have their Chic Nic on August 27th at Wallace State Park, will be wrecking 2 PG's, and took a truck load of clothes to Joplin; Voiture 1403 has 3 nurses in training, has Ribs to Go at the holidays, they go to the Colombia Veterans Hospital to volunteer once a month; Voiture 1541 is over 100%, has 5 nurses in training.

Grand Historien, Richard Pack said he received one history book to judge and this is from Voiture 1541.

Terry Lanning said, on behalf of Grand Directeur Child Welfare Hallie Williams, there were 7 reports received for a total of \$117,254. 1st place is Voiture 460, 2nd place is Voiture 38, and 3rd place is Voiture 448.

Grand Directeur Voiture Activities George Ridley said he received 8 reports. 1st place is Voiture 38, 2nd place is Voiture 460, and 3rd place is Voiture 130.

Sous Grand Directeur Nurses Training Chris Bryson said he received 5 reports. 1st place is Voiture 460, 2nd place is Voiture 130, and 3rd place is Voiture 333.

Grand Aumonier John Paul Kopp says he needs a list of deceased voyageurs for the Grand Promenade Memorial Service.

Terry Lanning said, on behalf of Grand Directeur Publiciste Charles Goodin, public relations reporting was light this year but those that reported showed that they were committed to the ideals and principals of the 40&8. He urged all Voitures to report annually to tell what we do and it shows the IRS what charitable activities we do. 1st place is Voiture 333, 2nd place is Voiture 1541, and 3rd place is Voiture 460.

Grand Organizer Robert Phillips said he is targeting forming a new Voiture around Kirksville.

Grand Directeur Americanism Robert Emery said he received 10 reports. 1st place is Voiture 1321, and 2nd place is Voiture 448.

Grand Directeur Box Car, Grant Willis said he received 6 reports. First place will get a new traveling trophy. 1st place is Voiture 460, 2nd place is Voiture 448, and 3rd place is Voiture 1541.

Grand Directeur Carville Star Leon Hill. 1st place is Voiture 1541, 2nd place is Voiture 448, and 3rd place is Voiture 460.

Grand Directeur POW/MIA David Diaz said to keep this program in your heart because it never ends. 1st place is Voiture 448, 2nd place is Voiture 460, and 3rd place is Voiture 1541.

Grand Directeur Ritual John Partin received 7 reports. 1st place is Voiture 38, 2nd place is Voiture 1541, and 3rd place is Voiture 333.

Grand Directeur Special Awards Arnold Miller received 4 reports. We did not have any Law Officers, Hero of the Year, or City of the Year so no awards.

Grand Chairman VAVS Thomas Berkley passed out information on My Health Net. Small Voiture awarded to Voiture 1379, medium Voiture awarded to Voiture 460, and large Voiture awarded to Voiture 448.

Sous Correspondant, Grant Willis, said to send him any articles and flyers to be put in the Grand Newsletter, which will be going out in August.

Time & Place Committee, Rich Heigert reported that the Fall Grand Cheminot & Homecoming (October 7-9, 2011) will be in Festus, Best Western. It looks like the Spring Wreck will be at the Ramada Inn in Kansas City off of Highway 435.

Distinguished Voyageur Award Committee Chairman Ray Brodzinski stated the award will be presented at the banquet.

Grand Aid de Camp Kevin Johnson said he didn't do anything.

Distinguished Guest Committee Richard Heigert said Chef de Chemin de Fer Hank Kwiatkowski was at Truman Day.

Terry Lanning spoke on the Central States Promenade 2011. It went really well and the Grand made about \$2,500. John Kopp said the raffles took in about \$2,000. John Paul Kopp thanked all of the ladies for their help and donations.

Old Business - Ed Jones said George Ridley was at Truman Day.

New Business - None

Under Good Of The Voiture - Rich Heigert said the Past Chef Club dues are due so see him.

Grand Chef de Gare Ebersold closed the Grand Cheminot in the proper manner at 2:50 PM.
